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

CAC offers services free of charge in five different areas:



 Child Protection Team provides comprehensive assessments, medical exams, forensic interviews, crisis intervention, psychosocial assessments and Advocacy Center case coordination. Services are available 24/7.

• Family Alliance provides therapeutic treatment to children who have been abused or neglected, have witnessed or experienced family violence, or have witnessed a violent crime or homicide.

• Prevention Services include an after-school/summer program in the Pine Manor neighborhood; parenting classes to court-ordered parents, high-risk families and the general public; and a United Way family resource center in East Fort Myers.

• Beesley's Paw Prints Pet Therapy Program provides trained and certified volunteer therapy animal teams to aid in the child's therapy process.


•Family Advocacy provides coordinated case management and advocacy services to children and families from the point of intake and throughout the investigation and intervention process.

NATIONAL STATISTICS

1 in 5 children in the US will be abused by their 18th birthday

90% of victimized children are abused by someone they know and trust 60% are acquaintances like teachers, neighbors or community leaders 30% are immediate or extended family Only 10% are strangers to the child

Many sexually abused children suffer trauma severe enough to negatively impact their adult lives. They're 3x more likely to abuse drugs or alcohol and 2x more likely to drop out of school.



Children who experience neglect and abuse and do not receive help are more likely to enter the juvenile justice system and more likely to become abusers later in life.
